supervised by their parents and aided by the trust project officer and directors.







Lakes in the Maigue Catchment

Lough Gur is the iconic lake of County Limerick and the Maigue River catchment area. Gur and Bleach Loughs are the only two catchment lakes included in the national lake monitoring programme because they are the only lakes in the county greater than 0.5km² in size. This means that many smaller lakes and ponds (e.g. Dromore, Kilbreedy Loughs, Doohyle and, Loughnagira) are not assessed for water quality.

Maigue Rivers Trust Chair Catherine Dalton

recently coordinated a FREE globally accessible open access book which can be accessed here <u>Lakes in Ireland – Mirrors of Change</u>. The book includes chapters on the history, geography and science, and highlights some of the growing threats that lakes face.



Giant Hogweed

Limerick City & County Council are continuing their great work to remove Giant Hogweed on the Loobagh and Morningstar rivers with plant digouts, stem injections with glyphosphate and flower head removal.

MRT continue to liaise with the network of landowners and individuals in the Morningstar and provide feedback on sightings over the coming years. The MRT have additionally submitted a LEADER funding application to build on the physical works funded by the council, by developing educational materials, workshops and training to increase community awareness and river stewardship.

River Walks?

Question:

Are there opportunities along the Maigue Rivers for scenic walks?



The MRT highlighted a number of potential river walks that could be explored across the catchment in the 2021 Recreation & Amenity Potential Report. These opportunities are only possible with landowner permission and small physical interventions (e.g. gates, kissing gates and stiles) and adequate parking points.

MRT is working with Ballyhoura Development and West Limerick Resources to explore the potential and identify actions for a walking trails along the lower Maigue river.
